One of the surgeons came and pulled out Blake's central line today. We do not want any risk of an infection. Blake is free of plastic in his veins!

We have been holding Blake once a day, usually in the evening. I enjoy holding my son so much. There is nothing better than holding your son and seeing your husband in him. Thank you Chad for giving me a son. You are a wonderful husband. I became tearful reading your email from Valentine's Day. Thank you sweetheart.

Please hold your children close and tell them how much you love them. Children are a present from God. Blake has enjoyed spending the day with grandpa today. Well, I better go watch Blake sleep.

Well, today is the day that we have all been waiting for! Kimberly phoned us this morning to let us know that the doctors plan to extubate (remove ventilator tube) today! The process will begin with a chest x-ray to make sure that there are no unforeseen problems. Blake will then be moved to a different ventilator machine. This final trial will be a very slow process

and will probably continue throughout most of the day. Once the doctors feel confident that Blake is ready -- they will remove the vent tube.

We ask that you offer up your special prayers for this brave little guy today! He has conquered so many obstacles and today's hurdle will definitely be a BIG one! With the strength of our prayer circle, we know that Blake will be breathing on his own by the end of the day! God continues to be good to us and we know that by His hand Baby Blake will make this very important step towards recovery.

We will try to keep you informed throughout the day of his progress. Thanks again for your love, support and most of all prayers. Grandpa and I are on our way to witness the big event. Love to all----

He hasn't cried yet, probably because he is hoarse. He has been trying to make a few sounds it just sounds raspy. I'm sure he will let out a cry in a few days. I held him skin to skin for about 2 hours. As I placed him in bed to change his diaper he opened his eyes and looked all around. He just looks so cute without all the tape on his face. Daddy is holding him now. Thank you so much for all your prayers. We need continued prayers so Blake doesn't become tired of breathing. Thank you. Have a good day!

Yesterday was the second best day for me as a Daddy. Of course Mommy and Son making it through the birth was the first, but yesterday was one of the best days we have endured in a while. Blake is breathing without the ventilator!!!!!! We need continued prayers for today, as the doctor's know that once the babies last 48 hours off the ventilators, they have a very good shot of staying off it completely. We are all cheering for you son!!! "You can do it..."

Blake was a little restless last night, and praise to Mommy for staying with him all night. I picked Kim up and returned her to the Ronald McDonald House as I was leaving for Austin this morning. (5:15 am) Believe me, Kimberly was ready and deserving for a soft pillow and some ZZZZ's. As I pulled into Austin I checked with Blake's nurse, and he was doing fine. Today is a very important day, as his endurance and strength will be tested as never before. Kimberly just called, and she feels better too after getting some rest. I love you dear...please keep your enthusiasm to hugs and kisses. And watch nurse Caroline too, the both of you still have that look in your eyes. No munching on little Blake!

My commute to Austin this morning was through a thick fog for most of the trip. I could not help drawing connections to our last four months and to Blake's fight for life. At times, we could not expect which turns lie ahead... We certainly could not see far ahead or if/when it would all end. Sometimes we thought we were through the toughest times, only for more to surround us unexpectedly. We , and I mean all of us (family & friends), know this route well. This is how life unfolds for us all. But we continue to blaze ahead with faith and hope for what lies ahead. I pray Blake is finding his way through this fog and ready to step out into the sunshine. I pray for the day when I see his face glowing from the warmth of the sun while bundled in his mommy's arms.

Warm greeting to all Blake followers.

Blake has done very well off of the ventilator. The critical 48 hour time frame after removing the breathing tube came and went without incident. He currently has a nasal canula, which is expected and will remain for some time. This is a huge step for our little fighter. I talked with Grandpa Kramr this morning. He sounded very excited to finally get to hold Blake. The other grandparents should have their "first holds" soon as well. Blake has been moved to a baby condo (enclosed bed) for now. They had noticed that when he was being held his saturation numbers had been close to 100% but when he was in his bed wrapped in a blanket they were not as high. But still very good. The thinking is that if he is not as confined then he may be more comfortable, therefore keeping his sats higher. The condo can help regulate his temperature without having the confinement of the blanket. This seems to be helping as yesterday evening his numbers were higher.

Update time....

Daddy here, due to some small signs of increased oxygen needed over the past couple of days...the doctors wanted to get a chest x-ray and blood gas report on Blake this morning. The x-ray showed that there was increased fluid in his lungs, and the blood gas report showed that Blake had more carbon dioxide in his blood than what they would like to see. Our little champion has been working hard the past week on breathing on his own and looks to need a little more assistance.

The doctors have changed Blake to Nasal CPAP, which is pressure/oxygen assistance at his nostrils. The doctors will try this first before re-intubating Blake. They want to do everything possible to not go back to the ventilator, but that may be needed. The good side of the coin, is that Blake

has shown us that he can breath on his own...he may need more time for his lungs to mature and grow before he can stay off the ventilator. For now...let's pray that the Nasal CPAP will provide enough help to clear up those lungs.

Prayers needed...of course this happens on a rainy day. Let's get that sun out quick. Love to you all, and especially to our beautiful and strong son Blake. Daddy is thinking of you...all my love.

Good afternoon,

As Chad described in the previous message regarding possible re-intubation, this did occur yesterday morning (Thurs). Blake did well on the nasal CPAP, although it was a challenge to keep the prongs in his nose. Grandma Johnson and I worked in shifts to watch over him closely on Wed night. Thursday morning it was time to do a chest x-ray. Blake was resting comfortably on his belly (favorite spot), but they had to turn him over on his back (least favorite spot) for the x-ray and he became very upset, clamped down and stopped breathing. Unfortunately the doctors and nurses came running and Blake had to be intubated again.

The sun is out today--Thank GOD!! Blake is resting comfortably on the ventilator. Daddy is at his side. He enjoys one of us holding his pacifier,

especially with the sucrose water we give him for a treat. Yes, he is sucking a pacifier even though there is a tube in his mouth. We have been doing this for months, so he doesn't reject the bottle when it is time to feed by mouth.

We HOPE the ventilator is only TEMPORARY. We are hoping that the decrease in fluid in his lungs clears with the lasix (pulls fluid out of his lungs) and decreasing his feeds (less volume). We need to pray that he continues to grow, so he will out grow his liver. Hopefully his liver will begin to shrink, so he will be able to breathe easier.

We have to remember, including myself that Blake did breathe on his own for 9 DAYS, which is a huge accomplishment!!! He WILL do it again!!

I love each and every one of you. I look forward to the day when Blake is back on nasal cannula. Thank you for your continued prayers. Please have a good weekend. Please do not take breathing for granted. It is a gift from GOD.

Good Morning Everyone,

I hope and trust this beautiful weather is signs of good days to come. I hope everyone is taking advantage of this spring break weather to get out and do 'whatever turns you on'. I know Kimberly is enjoying that room with a view, as Blake was moved to an isolation room that looks into a courtyard with blooming flowers. Having sunshine flood his room will certainly remind us that everyone's love and support are flowing his way.

We received a good report from the cardiologist as they were reviewing Blake's latest echocardiogram and felt the PA Band and the VSDs were not contributing to Blake's fluid build-up in his lungs. Therefore no immediate heart surgery needed. It was this build-up of fluid that worked toward Blake needing ventilator support again. For now, the doctor's want to see

good weight gain and continued decreasing oxygen requirements. We will get back to pressure support trials soon...

One humorous update that Mommy and Daddy love as it proves Blake is like all little boys. Blake has learned to 'toot'. I know, the little things...but you have to laugh. As his feedings have increased, we have noticed to be careful when changing his position or picking him up to hold him. The movement will help relieve some built up surprise...just for Mommy and Daddy. 'Boys will be boys.'

Though we have been a little disappointed since Blake went back to the ventilator, looking at the bright side of things reminds us how far Blake has come. Thanks to everyone's prayers and support we will endure this test. Blake is giving us his all, and with God's will...he will one day come home.

Please send prayers for Mommy's strength as she surely feels she is repeating the same day over and over again. I love you dear...and can't wait to return to Houston tomorrow. Let the sunshine in.

Good Monday to you all, Mommy here with Blake. Today Blake was moved to a big boy bed--A crib!! The cushion is much thicker than the bed with the warmer. (plastic tray as Grandma Kramr calls it). As the nurse

and RT switched the beds, I stood and held Blake and rocked him. He liked to be rocked. I wanted to walk him around the room, but the ventilator tubes would not reach. He fell fast asleep after we placed him in the crib. Finally a CRIB after 5 months!!!!!!

The doctor weaned the O2 a little from 38% to 35%. His blood gas looked great! Everyone was impressed. I wanted to wean him again, but we need to take baby steps. We are hoping to start pressure support trials at the end of the week. If you remember this is where Blake would breathe on his own for a couple of hours. The order for now is to keep growing and shrink the liver, were a little lower than last week!

I want to wish Grandma Johnson a HAPPY BIRTHDAY!!! I also wanted to share that a few of the cousins were able to see Blake through the window this weekend. Your face and hand prints are still on the glass--Brooks, Kristen and Chase. The nurses got a kick out of seeing you through the glass. We were the first family to leave our prints on the window.
